Message from Pastor Cathy Morris

From Jesus' Sermon on the Mount--

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"You are the light of the world." Have you ever thought of yourself as "the light of the world?" Jesus is telling us in this scripture passage, that each one of us, all of his disciples, have a light within us that we are to shine before others. It is a light given to us to use for the sake of God's world.

The photos surrounding this letter, are scenes from creation that I hope will help you to "let your light shine." In photo 1, we see a bunny (yes, it is there, can you find it) trying to blend in with his/her surroundings. This bunny is trying to hide its light "under the bushel basket," even though the bunny remains in plain view! This can happen with you, too, when you try to blend in, or don't believe that you are capable of doing more, or of being a leader. This is what happens when you hide your talents, skills, and spiritual gifts "under the bushel basket."

In photo 2, we see another bunny in the midst of a field of green. This bunny is using his/her senses to help determine what to do. It is listening, it is looking at what is around him/her with eyes wide open, it is taking things in to determine how to begin its journey. You can do this too. You can use your senses, and your other God given gifts to survey the needs around you in the church and world, and in so doing, "let your light shine." Con't

In photo 3, we see two birds. They are surveying the situation, but they are also poised to take off! They are going to take on whatever lies ahead, to use their whole selves to accomplish the task, and to do it together. Seeing these birds can encourage you to begin your journey, and to do it with someone else. In this way, you can "let your light shine," and encourage others to join you too!

In photo 4, we see a deer. It has begun it's journey and is halfway to its goal. It has set out, and it is already making good progress. Now it has stopped to look back to see how far it has come! This is what all of us can do from time to time. To see what we have accomplished thus far for God's glory, and to set out again to complete the rest of our jour ney.

The scripture passage above, speaks to all of us, but specifically to each one of us by using the word, "you." <u>You</u> are not to hide "your light under a bushel." Rather, <u>you</u> are to do God's work in the world, and in so doing, bring attention not to yourself, but to God.

This passage made me think about ways in which each of you can use your spiritual gifts. For children, this could be through Sunday school or Confirmation class. For youth, this could be in taking on a special project at church with friends. For youth and adults, this could mean helping in multiple ways-participating on a church committee, seeing something that needs to be done, and offering to do it; organizing or helping with a special event, joining W-ELCA or quilting, being a reader or cantor during worship, organizing a "God's Work, Our Hands" activity, etc... There are many possibilities, but each requires taking the first steps.



You can begin your journey by talking with a council member, a committee chair, our W-ELCA president, Carolyn, or me. In this way, you can take your first step to "let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

From the Council President

As we move into fall, we will be transitioning back to our "normal" schedule – Sunday school at 9:00 am and worship service at 10:15am will start on September 12th.

Even though we are going back to our normal times, the world is still not yet back to normal. The last 2 months have shown us that this pandemic is far from over. At the beginning of July, we were all hopeful that the pandemic was almost over as average infection rates in Wisconsin dropped to 60 cases a day. Since then however, cases have increased 25 times to over 1500 a day, including 150 cases this past week in Monroe County. These are infection rates not seen since January.

So what will that mean for us? We will continue to have indoor services. We will also continue to follow CDC recommendations. We highly recommend masking for everyone, regardless of vaccination status.

This is especially true for our youth as we will require them to wear masks as we resume Sunday school for the first time in 18 months.

We will continue to practice physical distancing in the sanctuary and in the basement classrooms. <u>And finally, we encourage all that</u> <u>are able to get vaccinated.</u>


Information from the August Council Minutes: The front stair repair has been tabled for the time being. Because of the complexity of the situation, many questions still remain including finding someone to do the project. LB

There are several regional agencies that are helping to coordinate assistance. The **mosques in Winona and La Crosse** are providing spiritual care. The **Red Cross** is at Fort McCoy, providing for their healthcare needs. **Catholic Charities** is at Fort McCoy, and they are also maintaining a list of needed items, which can be found at www.cclse.org

The La Crosse Area Synod Church in Society Committee is coordinating efforts for the synod congregations. They are encouraging us to support the efforts of those listed above (in bold type). For more information as to how you can help, go to their websites, or contact Nalani or me for addresses where you can send monetary donations. On the national level, you are encouraged to support Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, www.lirs.org The Bible tells us that we are to attend to the needs of refugees. In Deuteronomy 10:18, we hear the words, "He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing."

As we look to ways in which we can help, our prayers are encouraged. Let us pray that the Afghan refugees will feel the embrace of many persons in the United States, as we provide prayers for their well-being, monetary donations and material support for our neighbors in need.

ELECTRONIC OFFERINGS

Have you considered electronic offerings? St. Paul's vendor for this service is VANCO Payment Solutions (endorsed by ELCA). We currently have a small number of members using this service. The expression "out of sight, out of mind" can apply to church offerings. Attend the service; the offering is usually dropped in the plate. Unable to attend the service; the offering is often not made or made-up.

For most members, electronic payments to public utilities or other businesses are common. With electronic offerings, you may choose the amount as well as the timing, i.e. weekly, bi-weekly, and monthly, etc. You may also determine your funding source, checking, savings, credit card. You may establish electronic offerings either directly with VANCO or through the church office. Nalani will provide you with additional information, if you so desire.

PIPE ORGAN UPDATE

"While we're at it" is a haunting phrase, especially when remodeling or renovating a house or organ. We repaired the bellows so it seemed a good time to upgrade the electrical panel in the organ chamber, replace a few damaged pipes, and tidy a few other things up. To quote a nursery rhyme "Humpty Dumpty sat

on a wall, Humpty Dumpty had a great fall. All the king's horses and all the king's men, Couldn't put Humpty together again."

The problem we are now facing involves following the wiring deep in the chamber and would literally mean we would, again, have to remove everything from the chamber, a time and money -consuming endeavor. Unless we can figure a way around this dilemma, it is simply not practicable to spend more at this time. If we are unable to complete this project, our contractor has offered to find a replacement organ and install the same at no cost to the church (other than

electrical modifications, if necessary). Trust me, this is a generous offer and one he does not have to make. I anticipate enough information will be available for the Council to make a determination within the next 2-3 weeks.



SCHOOL KITS

We will be sending School Kits to Lutheran World Relief again

this year. These kits are distributed throughout the world as well as here in the United States. The following is a list of items included in a kit:

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper,

approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; no loose leaf paper

- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ONE pencil sharpener
- ONE pair of **blunt tipped** scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ONE 2 1/2" eraser

We generally transport the school kits in the LWR boxcar which will be in La Crosse this year on October 9. Please have items to the church by Sunday, October 3. Thank you for helping to make school a possibility, especially for those who would otherwise be refused without supplies.


