- 3. Approval to enter into a contract with HSR Associates, La Crosse, WI, in the amount of \$40,750.00.


(Phase 1: Construction Documents:

Phase 2: Bidding and Construction Administation 8,000 Lump Sum

(Total \$40,750)

The project is estimated to cost \$350,000-\$450,000. We have asked to include storage under the steps. The architect feels this might drive the project toward the higher amount and might, in fact, be cost prohibitive. We won't know until we get bids.
