FIRST READING

¹⁶O LORD, by these things people live, and in all these is the life of my spirit. Oh, restore me to health and make me live! Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On May 19, my letter to you was about the Pentecost Rose (also known as the peony). I shared with you its significance, the importance of the color red, and its association with Pentecost.

Since that time, I have been trying to find a red peony bush to photograph. (Apparently, white and pink peonies are more fragrant, and therefore, more numerous. I saw some red peony bushes on Hwy 16 just outside of Sparta, but I was driving too fast to safely slow down, pull off, and take a photo.) I am happy to report that I finally found a red peony bush that I could easily photograph!

Last week, I was at Central Express in Cashton. As I was seated at one of the picnic tables on the side of the building, I looked to my right. In the backyard of one of the neighboring houses, there was a **Red Pentecost Rose bush!** I took a photo (See attached) to share with all of you.

Today is the Third Sunday after Pentecost. We will gather virtually in worship with parishioners from most of the 74 synod churches. The churches are located in Buffalo, Jackson, Trempealeau, Crawford, Vernon, Adams, Monroe, Juneau, La Crosse and Houston (MN) counties. This opportunity to worship together, as we recall the Synod Assembly title, "...We will sing," allows us to celebrate our oneness as brothers and sisters in Christ.

As we gather with parishioners from throughout the La Crosse Area Synod to-day, let us be reminded of Pentecost. On that day almost 2,000 years ago, people gathered together and experienced the work of the Holy Spirit. May we too experience the Holy Spirit at work in the people, programs, committees, and ministries of the La Crosse Area Synod today and in the future, as we seek to do God's work in the world. Thanks be to God.


